Race format



Cockburn circuit, 1070m clockwise. 289 point system. All points count. Highest points on day is winner of day. 5 heats (ballot, reverse ballot, highest to front, highest to rear, highest to front).

All heats 8 laps. TKC and stewards of the day reserve the right to alter the number of laps to suit conditions on the day.

Where possible and practical, compatible classes may be combined at the discretion of the stewards.

Minimum entries

4 entries constitute a class. Classes not subscribed by close of entry date may be cancelled. Be sure to get your entries in on time!

Track density

Cockburn circuit @ 1070m is licensed for 40 karts. Track direction will be clockwise.

Prizes

Trophies for 1st, 2nd, 3rd on day.

- Competitors should refer to www.kartingwa.com.au for latest addendums relating to 2009 racing season
- Drivers are not permitted on track to practice (Sunday) until they have completed driver registration and handed in their Scrutineering form.
- Sportsman classes to run according to WA State Rules 2009, and relevant chapters of AKA Karting Manual 2009. (refer to Chapters 31 and 34) W/C cooled entrants to run at 5 kg heavier than A/C. (Note: Kart weight increases accordingly for W/C entrants).
- Kart numbers must conform to Rule 25.17 - this includes numbers on side pods. Failure to conform will result in not getting through scrutineering and/or not being lap scored correctly
- Head sealing nuts must be fitted to engines as per rule 19.33. When engine seals are issued, competitor is to fit them, but must leave the tail at full length.
- Restrictors (**Midgets/Rookies**) will be sealed. Must have nut fitted on exhaust as per AKA Karting Manual 2009 Rule 41.27 (Midgets) and Rule 40.06 (Rookies)
- No dogs, no skateboards, no bicycles, no bad manners at circuit at all. No smoking, no alcohol in pit area/s at any given time.
- Canteen open with full service Sunday from 8.30 am. Bar service operating from 12 noon for those not involved in day's racing who are over 18.

STATE RULES 2009 KART STARS WA SERIES

1. "Kart Stars WA" class champions will be allocated red plates (to be supplied by AKA(WA) with white numbers bearing their own state number. The plates are to be used only in the class they were awarded (1ST PLACE ONLY) and only within Western Australia. Winners will also have their photos included into the State Calendar for the following year.
2. For a CLASS to be eligible for final series points the CLASS must have a minimum of four (4) entries to constitute a class.
3. For a COMPETITOR to be eligible for final series points the COMPETITOR must nominate and compete in all available meetings.
4. All points scored will count towards the final points tally for each driver.
5. CLASSES that have not run at the first round and are therefore ineligible for the series do not need to be offered over the remaining rounds. The host club may choose to offer the class as a support class.
6. To be eligible to compete in this series, a competitor must have a minimum of an AKA C Grade Licence.
7. **CLASSES:**
Midgets, Rookies, Junior National Combined (130kg), Junior Sportsman, Sportsman 100 Medium (150kg), Sportsman 100 Super Heavy, (*Super Heavy maximum kart weights: air cooled 88kgs, water cooled 93kgs*) Sportsman 125 Light (160kg) Sportsman 125 Heavy (180kg) Over 40's, Open
8. **FORMAT:** 289 Point System
5 Heats - Ballot
 Reverse Ballot
 Highest to Front
 Highest to Rear
 Highest to Front
9. Individual clubs to adjust laps to accommodate classes on the day.
10. Closing date for entries: 7 days from event. Late entries will be accepted up to last post on the Friday prior to the event on subscribed classes only and may be put rear of field for first two (2) heats.
No entries will be accepted on the day of competition.
11. **ENTRY FEE** (*all fees inclusive of GST (where applicable) and National and State Track Development Levies*)
Senior - \$60.00 Junior/Rookie/Midget - \$40.00
(*For all classes, if person is racing more than one class, second or subsequent entry fee will be \$25.00.*)
