

MESSAGE TO KARTING VICTORIA AND CLUBS
3 June 2021

Good Afternoon,

Further to the Acting Premier of Victoria’s announcement yesterday, we are still waiting on the Public Health Orders to be published.

Unfortunately, there is no change for the Melbourne Clubs - Go-Kart Club of Victoria and Oakleigh Go-Kart Racing Club for at least another seven days., However, based on the Table of Restrictions that has been published by the Victorian Government, there is some positive news for the Regional Clubs.

	Regional Victoria (subject to health advice)	Metropolitan Melbourne
Outdoor physical recreation & sport	Open: A maximum patron cap of 50 people per venue. Group sizes to a maximum of 10 people. Density quotient of 1 person per 4sqm applies. Community sport: Permitted for children. Training purposes only for adults	Closed: Outdoor playgrounds remain open

Based on the above information, it is feasible for the **Regional Clubs to host Social karting Days from tomorrow.**

- They must be managed in accordance with the guidelines previously provided by Karting Australia and
- Can only be attended by people who live in Regional Victoria (outside of Greater Melbourne)
- A maximum of 50 people can be in attendance –
- The maximum number of people in any single group is 10 people

All Clubs must be using the Victorian QR Code Check In App, **it is a requirement from the Victorian Government.**

All of the other Social Karting requirements that have been in place for many months must be properly implemented. This includes the use of the multi-QR code posters (see right for an example of the artwork has previously been forwarded to your Club).

We are working closely with Karting Victoria on monitoring the situation and they will be doing the same with Clubs with upcoming events. At this stage, the planning for the Australian Kart Championship round being hosted by the Eastern Lions Kart Club is continuing but the final decision on whether the event is possible will be made at some stage next week.

While the Public Health Direction is yet to be published following yesterday’s announcement. Should it alter anything for our sport, we will advise you as soon as possible.
